
Providing palliative care continues to be a challenge for all health professionals. These units of competency are designed to improve knowledge in various aspects of palliative care.

Sessions are class size limited and encourage participant interaction so that students and facilitators may draw on their own personal experiences in palliative care.

These nationally recognised units of competency are offered by Banksia Palliative Care Service Inc to services and facilities across Victoria and Australia.

ABOUT THE UNIT OF COMPETENCE

The unit of competence CHCPAO1A: Deliver Care Services Using a Palliative Approach is nationally recognised. The competency unit aims to enable care workers caring for clients requiring a palliative approach to have the opportunity to develop the necessary skills and knowledge to provide evidence based care to clients and their families. The unit covers all aspects of palliative approach including management of pain and other symptoms, advance care directives, client dignity and self care for the care worker.

Learners undertaking this unit may include aged care workers employed in aged care homes, home and community care workers, disability workers and community health workers. They may or may not be enrolled in a qualification such as the Certificate III in Aged Care Work. Learners may also undertake the unit as part of a professional development program.

A statement of attainment will be issued for successful completion of this unit of competency.
